You will receive notification of classes when you arrive at camp.

4-H CAMP CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Animal Farm – Goats, horses, chickens, and cows, oh my! Campers will gain hands-on experience and learn basic knowledge and animal care for a variety of animals living at the 4-H Center. In addition, campers will get an opportunity to partake in lead line horseback rides taught by a qualified & trained instructor. Participants will be required to sign an equine waiver and wear closed-toe shoes.

<u>Archery</u> – Want to be the next Robin Hood? This is the class for you! Learn basic archery skills, safe shooting techniques, and proper handling of equipment. Taught by a qualified & trained instructor. Participants are required to wear closed-toe shoes. The class will emphasize safety at all times.

<u>Camp Paparazzi</u> – Lights, camera, action! Showcase your multimedia skills like photography, video, reporting and blogs. Campers will be using iPads to document and tell the stories of summer camp. The class will be making the camp week's slideshow, as well as, blogs and videos posted to the 4-H Center's social media.

<u>Center Stage</u> – Let Barter Theatre's Project REAL teaching artist guide you through the creative process of theatre through voice, movement, acting, and play creation. This class will expose you to the wonderful world of theatre!

<u>Cooking Over Campfires</u> – Whether you are under the sun filled with blue sky or a blanket of bright stars, learn how to cook outdoors! Campers will gain basic outdoor cooking skills while learning safety, how to build, and of course, delicious recipes for campfires. Taught by a qualified and trained instructor.

<u>Challenge in the Woods</u> – Challenge yourself! You and your team will learn to communicate and work together as you tackle the many Low Ropes Course elements and Team Building initiatives! Taught by a qualified & trained instructor. Participants are required to wear closed-toe shoes.

<u>Electric and Explosive Science</u> – Satisfy your desire to watch things explode, erupt, and light up!! Make your teachers proud when you return to school knowing just a little bit more about chemistry and electricity. This class will take you through weird and fun science that will challenge you, leave you in awe, and screaming to do it one more time for the fun of it all.

<u>Game ON!</u> – Do you like to play video games? Well now you can learn how to create your own games using a variety of computer programs. At the end of camp, you will be able to enter the *Game on Tournament* for a chance to win the title of Game Master!

<u>Hook Line and Sinker</u> – Campers will test their skills to try to catch the biggest fish of the summer! Campers will learn basic fishing skills while also learning about the fish's role in nature. All equipment will be provided.

<u>Leather Crafts</u> – (*There is a \$3 Materials Fee for this class*) Learn how to use the materials and tools in designing a special leather creation for you to take home. As your skill and enthusiasm grows, you will want to learn how to make more items with leather. It will be an enjoyable adventure.

Outdoor Life – Campers will go hands-on and wild in exploring how to survive the 4-H Center's wilderness! Learn how to build campfires & shelters, knots, orienteering, flora and fauna identification, and so much more! Participants are required to wear closed-toe shoes. Outdoor life will be offered only 2nd & 3rd periods. Campers enrolled in the Wilderness Camping Program are automatically signed-up for the class (both periods). Campers <u>not</u> enrolled for the Wilderness Camping Program can still sign-up for this class (for one period or both periods).

<u>Sharp Shooters</u> – Learn to shoot and safely handle BB guns, air rifle pellet guns, and .22-cal. rifles in this class. Taught by a qualified & trained instructor. Participants are required to wear closed-toe shoes. The class will emphasize safety at all times.

<u>Tie-Dye</u> – Add some color to your life. <u>Please bring a shirt or any other white item to tie-dye in this exciting class.</u>

<u>Water Sports</u> – Let's get in the pool and have some fun! Swimmers will participate in a variety of water sports and activities, while learning some basic swim techniques and skills. Taught by qualified and trained instructors, a lifeguard is on duty during this class. Participants are required to bring their own swimsuit.

Rappelling and Zipline will not be a class choice this year. It will be an afternoon activity available for campers age 12 and up.
