



The rural beauty of Dickenson County is best appreciated from the Birch Knob observation tower 3,273 feet above sea level.

2021 was the first time that Dickenson County participated in the Virginia Tech Giving Day campaign. Donors gave to Dickenson County exceptionally well and the Extension office is proud of the generosity of its community! Based on its 53 donors, Dickenson County placed fourth in the state! This is from a county with a population under 15,000 people, a median household income under \$30,000 per year, and a poverty rate of 24.2%. When compared to counties with similar population size, Dickenson County ranked first in Virginia. This indicates how much a rural, economically challenged community values the programs of Virginia Cooperative Extension.


